
Textiles for recycling

- Paired shoes

Usable and unusable textiles can be put in the collection bins for recycling. Please pack in bags!



What doesn't go into the organge

- Fur and leather clothing, belts
- Cleaning rags, fabric scraps
- Carpets
- Foam, rubber mats
- Skates and roller skates. Rubber boots, ski boots, Light-up shoes
- Suitcases and bags




What goes in the bottle banks:

 Glass packaging (disposable bottles, disposable iars). sorted by colour, empty, no caps

Please note:


To avoid noise disturbance, please drop off your recycling at the following times:

Mon to Fri 7.00 a.m. to 8.00 p.m. Sat 7.00 a.m. to 2.00 p.m.



What doesn't go in the bottle banks:

- Window and plate glass
- Mirror and wire-reinforced glass
- Light bulbs, fluorescent tubes, energy-saving bulbs
- Crystal and drinking glasses, vases, bowls
- Heat-resistant glass
- Ceramics, porcelain, stoneware
- Returnable bottles



Lightweight packaging



What goes in the yellow bins:

Packaging made of plastic, metal, natural and composite materials, such as

- Plastic bottles for washing-up liquid, detergent and personal-care products
- Dairy-product containers
- Coated freezer product packaging
- Polystyrene foam
- Cans. crown corks
- Cotton nets, wooden boxes
- Milk and beverage cartons
- Aluminium trays, spray cans

Please note:

Before disposing of your packaging, please empty it carefully but don't rinse it especially. Do not stack the various items of packaging inside one another; simply press flat together.

What doesn't go in the yellow bins:

- Non-packaging items made of plastic and metal
- Household goods, broken toys
- Polystyrene ceiling panels. construction waste
- Beverage packaging with refundable deposit
- Glass, paper
- Residual and organic waste

Organic



What goes in the organic waste bins:

- Fruit and vegetable scraps, nutshells and eggshells
- Food scraps
- Meat and bone remains (normal household quantities)
- Coffee grounds with filter bag, tea bags, tea leaves
- Tropical fruit peelings
- Plant waste, cut flowers, fallen fruit
- Hedge, bush and tree clippings, leaves
- Feathers, hair, small-animal litter (from herbivorous pet animals, biodegradable)


Please note:

Do not use plastic bags of any kind. Wrap moist organic waste in kitchen paper or newspaper before disposing of it.

What doesn't go in the organic waste bins:

- Plastic bags/packaging, bioplastics
- Packaged food
- Glass, nappies, rubbish, stones
- Cigarette butts, vacuum-cleaner bags
- Cat litter and dog excrement
- Charcoal, ash, wood
- Dead pets, livestock and wild animals

Residual



What goes in the residual waste bins:

- Ash (cooled), rubbish, cigarette butts
- Slides, photos, film negatives
- Bicycle tyres, rubber and leather scraps
- Tableware, ceramics, mirror glass, light bulbs
- Hygiene products, face masks (mouth-nose covers), household rapid tests, nappies
- Cat and dog excrement, litter from carnivorous pets
- Adhesive labels, sausage skins
- Leftover wallpaper, vacuum-cleaner bags
- Bandages, soiled packaging

Please note:

If large quantities of waste are produced, residual waste sacks can be used for which a fee is charged.

What doesn't go in the residual waste bins:

- Bulky waste, vehicle parts
- Hazardous waste, batteries. power packs
- Electrical and electronic devices
- Construction waste
- Recyclable waste
